TAX TIPS Travel Expenses



Bon Voyage! Are you someone who likes to travel? Whether you're attending a seminar or just getting away for the weekend while also putting in a few promotional plugs or presentations for your business, this can be a good deduction for the business traveler. You may deduct a portion of your travel expenses when traveling "primarily" for your business. Keep all documentation and receipts of your business contacts, meals, lodging and expenses. When traveling abroad, expenses are usually divided between business and vacation. Discuss the differences with your CPA or tax advisor so you're clear on what are legitimate deductions.


Marketing Materials - Mailings - Passing Out Samples

Your marketing materials, business cards, brochures, copies and printing related to your business are deductible. You can also write off the cost of product sample packs that you hand out to prospects! Any mailings you do, your post cards or mail pieces, your name labels and postage are deductible. Also any advertising you do for your business is deductible. Remember... keep your receipts.

No Hobby Losses

It's very important that you understand that, in order for your tax deductions to apply, your Home-Based Business must be a real business. This means that you must treat your business as a "for profit" business and not a "hobby." This is why it is so important to work regular hours to promote and build your business. Be committed and dedicated to treat your business as a legitimate "for profit" venture.

Business Gifts



You can demonstrate your appreciation to your business associates, those in your sales organization and customers while enjoying a deduction of up to \$25 for the cost of your business gifts given directly or indirectly to these individuals. Again, you want to check with your CPA or tax advisor for the latest gift write offs.

Home Office Deductions






You want to make sure and check with your CPA or tax advisor regarding your home office deductions. As we mentioned earlier, there are a number of deductions you can use. Also, if you qualify you can deduct a portion of expenses related to your home, such as mortgage payments, insurance, utility bills and home repairs. You can also deduct your office space, that's the area you use for your business if you use that area exclusively for your business.

Mileage

Mileage between meetings, seminars, business lunches, dinners and more can make for a sizable deduction in your favor as a business owner. Your CPA or tax advisor can discuss the options available, either the IRS's standard cents per mile deduction, or itemizing the auto expenses, insurance and depreciation.




Computers, Automobiles, and Capital Assets



The Costs of your computer, automobile and other capital assets used exclusively for your business can provide for additional deductions. Your CPA or tax advisor can cover the choices you will need to make about how to deduct these costs and to determine whether the deduction can be taken in any given year or over a number of years.

Additional Business Expenses





Business supplies and business equipment are an integral part of operating your business. Usual deductions can include such items as general business and office supplies, telephone costs, answering machines, fax machines, office furniture, office decorations that improve your office, accounting fees, license fees, etc.

Wages Paid To Your Children

Wages paid to your children for help in your Business may be deductible; for children under the age of 14, who have no other source of income, wages under \$4,000 per year may be deductible. Make sure that you check with your CPA or tax advisor.



Record Keeping



The key to effective deductions is to document everything! So, make sure you keep a record of all your business-related expenses. Write down with whom you spoke, when and where you traveled in conjunction with your business, etc. Keep a separate bank account for your business, and retain all records and receipts from all purchases and transactions. Consistent record keeping demonstrates to the IRS that you are operating a business – not a hobby! Remember, your time and effort could be worth thousands of dollars a year in tax savings!
